THE PHD PROGRAM

The Masters program in the Manship School of Mass Communication focuses on media and public affairs, and helps students build the skills needed for a professional career or serves as a pathway to a doctoral degree. Small, select classes provide graduate students with outstanding opportunities to work closely with faculty and talented students. A network of alumni and media leaders keeps the school closely tied to the professional community, helping to create innovative partnerships that benefit students.

The Masters program provides students with a comprehensive program. Students can take courses in mass communication, public affairs, political communication, print and broadcast journalism, advertising, and public relations.

The Manship School of Mass Communication is home to the nation's only doctoral program focused on political communication through a course of study in media and public affairs in partnership with the Department of Political Science. The program prepares students for careers in academic research and teaching, political consulting, or in government, non-profit, corporate or media organizations.

The school admits small classes of approximately five Ph.D. students each year and provides an excellent financial-support package, including stipends and tuition waivers. Students also have opportunities for travel stipends and research funding. Students build a comprehensive program of study with personal attention and guidance from senior faculty members, and have opportunities for collaborative research.
